#### A. EXPLANATORY NOTES TO THE INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE QUARTER ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2011

#### A1. Basis of preparation

This Interim Financial Report ("Report") is unaudited and has been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standards ("FRS") 134 - Interim Financial Reporting and Paragraph 9.22 of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad ("Bursa Securities").

The Interim Financial Report should be read in conjunction with the Audited Financial Statements of the Group for the financial year ended 31 May 2010. This revised FRS does not have any impact on the financial position and results of the Group since these changes affect only the presentation of items of income and expenses.

#### Amendment to FRS 117 - Leases

The considerations paid were classified and presented as prepaid lease payment on the statement of financial position. With the adoption of the Amendment to FRS 117, the classification of a leasehold land as a finance lease or an operating lease is based on the extent to which risks and rewards incident to ownership lie. Accordingly, the Group has changed the classification of certain leasehold lands from operating leases to finance leases in the current quarter. This change in classification has no effect to the profit or loss of the current period ended 28 February 2011 or the comparative prior period. #### B1. Review of Group's Performance

For the nine months ended 28 February 2011, the Group posted lower revenue of RM1.01 billion compared with RM1.10 billion a year ago. In the same period, the Group posted loss before taxation from continuing operations of RM4.2 million against profit before taxation ("PBT") of RM27.5 million in the same period last year.

The Group results reflect primarily lower sales contribution from the Agricultural & Industrial Chemical Division. Sales for the division declined to RM813.9 million from RM920.0 million a year ago due to weaker demand and lower prices for the industrial chemical products. The industry is facing an oversupply situation and stiff competition in the region.

On a quarterly basis, revenue for the current financial quarter ended 28 February 2011 was RM367.1 million compared with RM362.1 million in the same quarter last year. PBT in the quarter amounted to RM6.6 million against PBT of RM5.7 million in the same quarter last year. The improvement in the current quarter results was achieved with higher sales posted by the media division.

# B2. Material Change in the Results for the Current Quarter as Compared with the Immediate Preceding Quarter

During the quarter under review, the Group revenue increased to RM367.1 million from RM351.6 in the immediate preceding quarter. Consequently, PBT rose to RM2.6 million against RM0.7 million in the immediate preceding quarter. Better performance was partially attributed to the improved contribution from the media division in the current quarter.

#### B3. Prospects

Based on the improved performance for the current quarter, the Directors expect, barring any unforeseen circumstances, the performance in the remaining quarter in the current financial year to be better.

#### B4. Variance from Profit Forecasts and Profit Guarantees

Not applicable as the Company did not provide any profit forecast and profit guarantee in respect of the current financial quarter.
