A. EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO MFRS 134 INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORTING

A1. Basis of preparation

The Condensed Consolidated Interim Financial Statements ("Condensed Report") are unaudited and have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Malaysian Financial Reporting Standard ("MFRS") 134 Interim Financial Reporting and paragraph 9.22 of the Main Market Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad. This Condensed Report also complies with International Accounting Standard 34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the International Accounting Standards Board. This Condensed Report should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements of Pecca Group Berhad ("Pecca" or the "Company") and its subsidiaries (the "Group") for the financial year ended 30 June 2025.

The explanatory notes to this Condensed Report provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the financial year ended 30 June 2025.

This Condensed Report is presented in Ringgit Malaysia ("RM") and all values are rounded to the nearest thousand (RM'000) except when otherwise indicated.

A2. Significant accounting policies

The significant accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in this Condensed Report are consistent with those adopted in the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 30 June 2025. B1. Performance review

1Q 2026 vs 1Q 2025

For the current quarter ended 30 September 2025 ("1Q 2026"), the Group recorded substantially higher revenue of RM60.6 million, compared to RM55.9 million in the preceding year corresponding quarter ended 30 September 2024 ("1Q 2025"). The increase was mainly driven by higher sales volume from the Automotive segment in both Malaysia and Indonesia operations, as well as contributions from the Aviation segment.

The upward revenue trend aligns with the increase in profit after tax ("PAT") for 1Q 2026, which rose by 5.6% to RM15.4 million, as compared to RM14.6 million recorded in 1Q 2025. Continued initiatives to improve production cost efficiency across all segments, combined with disciplined management of selling and distribution expenses, enabled the company to maximise profitability through economies of scale. Nevertheless, the reduction in finance income was primarily due to the utilisation of cash and cash equivalents for dividend payouts, which reward the continued support of shareholders, and for the acquisition of property, plant and equipment to support the Group's ongoing business expansion plan.

The Group's revenue was primarily driven by the manufacturing of car seat covers, the sewing and manufacturing of car accessories covers and miscellaneous seat covers, the provision of wrapping and stitching services, as well as the supply of leather cut pieces within the automotive segment across both Malaysia and Indonesia operations. The automotive segment contributed approximately 98.5% of the total Group's revenue, with OEM accounting for 91.5%, REM for 3.9%, and PDI for 3.1%. Meanwhile, the aviation segment contributed approximately 1.3% of total Group revenue.

For 1Q 2026, the Group achieved a solid performance, with revenue increasing by 15% to RM60.6 million from RM52.8 million recorded in 4Q 2025. This growth was primarily driven by higher sales volume for car seat covers in both Malaysia and Indonesia operations, along with contributions from the Aviation segment.

Correspondingly, the Group recorded a higher PAT for 1Q 2026, rising by 14% to RM15.4 million from RM13.5 million in 4Q 2025. The improvement in profitability was supported further by continued production cost efficiencies and effective cost control measures, which together helped increase overall profit.

B3. Prospects

<u>Automotive segment</u>

Malaysia's automotive sector recorded a total industry volume of 579,336 units in the first nine months of 2025, a 2.8% moderation from 595,883 units in the same period of 2024, according to the Malaysian Automotive Association. Vehicle sales are expected to improve towards the year end, supported by promotional campaigns and stronger demand for battery electric vehicles ("BEVs") ahead of the expiry of the tax exemption for completely built-up BEVs.

The Group remains focused on its strategic expansion to achieve Tier-1 automotive component manufacturer status, and continues to make progress on its upcoming second manufacturing facility at the UMW High Value Manufacturing Park in Serendah, Selangor. The facility, with Phase 1 targeted for the second half of 2026, will be vital in supporting the rising demand for aviation and automotive seating, upholstery, and interior components, while enhancing the Group's ability to serve its expanding customer base.

Original Equipment Manufacturer ("OEM")

In the OEM segment, the Group is expanding its operations to become a full solution provider for integrated interiors, enabling it to offer a wider range of services and venture into more integrated segments across the automotive value chain. The expansion includes full seat assembly and broadening its portfolio of complex components, such as commencing mass production of an innovative instrument panel leather wrap by the end of 2025 for a customer's upcoming electric vehicle model launch.

The Group continues to pursue OEM contracts for the manufacturing of upholstery car seat covers in Indonesia via its subsidiary, PT Pecca Gemilang Indonesia, to increase the Group's market share in the Indonesian automotive sector. Meanwhile, PT Pecca Gemilang Indonesia continues to secure projects from OEM, Replacement Equipment Manufacturer ("REM"), and Pre-Delivery Inspection customers for the sewing and supply of automotive seat and accessory covers.

Replacement Equipment Manufacturer ("REM")

The Group is strengthening its REM product reach across local and international markets, including the United Kingdom, Saudi Arabia, Netherlands, the United States, Singapore, Australia, New Zealand, as well as the broader Middle East, and Europe. These markets continue to exhibit consistent demand for customised, high-quality REM parts.

Aviation segment

Malaysia's aviation sector is poised for sustained growth as the country's aerospace industry revenue is expected to hit RM30.0 billion in 2025 from RM25.1 billion (US\$5.93 billion) in 2024. The positive outlook points to sustained long-term growth in the aerospace and aviation sectors, reinforcing Malaysia's position as a regional Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul ("MRO") hub and resulting in greater demand for MRO services.

The aviation segment is demonstrating its strong growth momentum, driven by the significant ramp-up of its MRO activities. The Group continues to secure multiple cabin interior refurbishment projects for domestic and international airlines, helicopters, and private aircraft, while actively pursuing new contracts for commercial and general aviation. The Group is also broadening its portfolio beyond MRO services to the application of additive manufacturing and carbon-fibre composite technologies, as well as the supply of aviation-grade consumables.

In addition to certifications obtained from the Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia and the European Union Aviation Safety Agency, the Group is pursuing certifications from other regional aviation regulators, including the Civil Aviation Authority of Thailand, the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation of Indonesia, and the Directorate General Technical Airworthiness of Malaysia. These certifications will further enhance the Group's credentials and support its regional expansion across SEA.

Group Outlook

The Group maintains a positive outlook for the financial year ending 30 June 2026. This outlook is supported by the new model pipeline from key customers and the significant ramp-up and contribution from new high-margin segments, including aviation, locomotive, and the REM export market.

The Group's growth strategy continues to prioritise geographic expansion and diversification across four key pillars: OEM, REM, Aviation, and Emerging Ventures. Operationally, the Group's focus is on enhancing its skilled craftsmanship, supported by automation and technology to meet demand for high-quality products, improve efficiency, and maintain cost competitiveness

As announced on 23 April 2018, the Board of Directors has approved the variation of the utilisation of IPO proceeds amounting to RM6.60 million and the extension of time for utilisation of IPO proceeds amounting to RM2.62 million for another 24 months from 19 April 2018. After due deliberation, the Board intends to undertake the variations to vary the utilization of the proceed for working capital and extend the frame to another 24 months from 19 April 2020 to 19 April 2022. In view of the Covid-19 pandemic and Movement Control Order enforced by the Government in March 2020 until the endemic which as announced in April 2022, the Board has approved to further extended the timeframe for utilisation of the proceeds for working capital for another 24 months from 19 April 2022 to 19 April 2024. Further extension of time for another 24 months from 19 April 2024 to 19 April 2026 has been approved by the Board because the REM segment is expanding to more export markets such as US, Middle East and Thailand.
