A. EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO MFRS 134 INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORTING

A1. Basis of Preparation

The interim financial report of Pekat Group Berhad ("Pekat" or "the Company") and its subsidiaries (collectively known as "the Group") have been prepared in accordance with Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards ("MFRS") 134: *Interim Financial Reporting* issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB") and Paragraph 9.22 of ACE Market Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad. This interim financial report also complied with IAS 34: *Interim Financial Reporting* issued by the International Accounting Standard Board ("IASB").

This interim financial report should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements of the Group for the financial year ended 31 December 2024 and the accompanying explanatory notes are an integral part of this interim financial report.

A2. Significant Accounting Policies

Significant accounting policies and methods of computation adopted by the Group and the Company in this interim financial report are consistent with those as disclosed in the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2024 of the Group and of the Company.

Adoption of new standards/amendments/improvements to MFRSs

At the beginning of the current financial period, the Group and the Company adopted new standards/amendments/improvements to MFRSs which are mandatory for the financial periods beginning on or after 1 January 2025.

During the current financial period under review, an interim dividend of 1.0 sen per ordinary share amounting to RM6.46 million for the financial year ending 31 December 2025 was paid by way of cash on 25 September 2025.

Comparison between the current quarter under review ("Q3 FY25") and preceding year corresponding quarter ("Q3 FY24")

In Q3 FY25, the Group recorded an increase in revenue of RM59.06 million or 71.5%, reaching RM141.70 million compared to RM82.64 million in Q3 FY24. This strong performance was driven by growth across all business divisions.

The power distribution equipment ("PDE") and solar divisions were the main growth drivers, contributing revenue increases of RM35.25 million and RM18.44 million respectively. The solar division's strong performance was primarily supported by the progress of a large-scale solar engineering, procurement, construction and commissioning ("EPCC") project under the Corporate Green Power Programme ("CGPP"), while the PDE division's result reflected its maiden contribution to the Group's revenue as compared to the Q3 FY24.

Meanwhile, the earthing and lightning protection ("ELP") and trading divisions also recorded steady growth, with revenue of RM16.67 million and RM16.97 million, representing increases of 38.4% and 4.6% respectively. The improvement was mainly attributable to stronger project execution and higher sales orders.

In line with higher revenue, the Group's profit after tax rose by RM5.38 million or 85.7% to RM11.66 million, compared to RM6.28 million in Q3 FY24.

Comparison between the current financial period-to-date ("9M FY25") and previous year financial period-to-date ("9M FY24")

The Group achieved revenue of RM419.01 million for 9M FY25, representing an increase of RM222.17 million or 112.9% from RM196.84 million in 9M FY24. This year-on-year growth underscores the Group's strong performance across all business segments.

The solar division was the primary growth driver, contributing an additional RM104.06 million or 83.8% growth to reach total revenue of RM228.23 million, mainly driven by progress on a large-scale solar EPCC project under the CGPP. The newly acquired PDE division also made a significant contribution, generating RM97.97 million in revenue during the period.

The ELP and trading divisions also delivered solid performances, with revenue increases of RM15.10 million and RM5.03 million, representing growth of 46.3% and 12.6% respectively, due to improved project execution and higher trading sales volumes.

The Group's other income declined significantly, as the previous corresponding period 9M FY24 included a one-off gain of RM3.21 million from the disposal of property, plant and equipment. Administrative expenses increased to RM52.81 million in 9M FY25, mainly due to workforce expansion and the inclusion of administrative expenses from the PDE division as compared to the preceding year's corresponding 9M FY24. Finance costs rose to RM3.93 million, primarily due to interest expenses on term loans and trade financing facilities used to fund the acquisition of the PDE division and the development of large-scale solar power plants under the CGPP, respectively.

In line with higher revenue, the Group recorded a higher profit after tax of RM37.91 million, an increase of RM23.18 million or 157.3% compared to 9M FY24. Profit after tax attributable to shareholders grew to RM33.36 million, resulting in basic earnings per share of 5.17 sen, up from 2.27 sen in the corresponding period last year.

The Group recorded revenue of RM141.70 million for Q3 FY25, representing an increase of RM14.71 million or 11.6% compared to RM126.99 million in the preceding quarter ended 30 June 2025 ("Q2 FY25").

The solar division was the main growth driver, contributing an additional RM10.20 million in revenue, mainly due to progress on a large-scale solar EPCC project under the CGPP. The trading and ELP divisions also recorded higher revenue compared to Q2 FY25, increasing by RM2.28 million and RM1.80 million respectively, supported by higher trading sales volumes and improved project execution.

Despite the higher revenue, the Group's gross profit margin declined to 22.5% in Q3 FY25, due to a greater revenue contribution from the large-scale solar EPCC project under the CGPP, which carries a lower margin than the residential solar segment. The residential solar segment experienced a temporary slowdown following the completion of the Net Energy Metering 3.0 ("NEM 3.0") programme.

Consequently, despite the higher revenue, the Group recorded a slightly lower profit after tax of RM11.66 million, representing a decrease of RM0.87 million or 7.0% compared to Q2 FY25, mainly due to the change in revenue mix.

B3. Commentary on Prospects

Malaysia remains committed to achieving net-zero carbon emissions by 2050, in line with the Paris Agreement and the National Energy Transition Roadmap. Under the 13th Malaysia Plan, the Government has set a target to increase the share of renewable energy in the national electricity mix to 35% by 2030, up from the current 29%. This commitment provides a strong foundation for sustained growth and investment opportunities within the renewable energy sector.

Supporting this transition, the Ministry of Energy Transition and Water Transformation launched the Corporate Renewable Energy Supply Scheme, enabling corporates to purchase renewable energy via the national grid at a fixed access charge. This market-liberalising initiative is expected to accelerate demand for corporate power purchase agreements, creating opportunities for solar photovoltaic EPCC providers.

To enhance grid stability and reliability, the Government has introduced several initiatives to promote the adoption of battery energy storage systems ("BESS") in large-scale solar projects. The Energy Commission of Malaysia has launched the MyBeST initiative, targeting 400 MW of battery capacity with 1,600 MWh of energy storage through four 100 MW/400 MWh projects scheduled to commence operations by 2027. For smaller self-consumption solar systems, the installation of BESS will also be mandatory for capacities exceeding 72 kWp starting January 2026 to support grid stability, while the removal of previous capacity limits for non-domestic users now allows systems to meet up to 100% of their electricity demand. These policy measures present opportunities for the Group to capitalise on the rising demand for renewable energy solutions, leveraging its technical expertise and established track record.

The Group is currently developing two 29.99 MWac solar power plants under the CGPP. One is an internal investment expected to generate recurring income upon completion by the first half of 2026, while the other, an EPCC project, is anticipated to continue contributing positively to the Group's financial performance throughout its construction period.

Meanwhile, the Group's ELP division will continue to capitalise on opportunities arising from increased foreign direct investment in Malaysia's data centre industry, supported by its strong track record in delivering ELP solutions for major data centre projects. In addition, Tenaga Nasional Berhad's higher capital expenditure to advance Malaysia's energy transition and decarbonisation initiatives is expected to spur demand for power distribution equipment, creating additional opportunities for the Group's PDE division.

Barring any unforeseen circumstances, the Board remains optimistic about the Group's prospects.
